a full spectrum of continuing care recovery services for adults over the age of 18 in the LGBTQ+ community. This includes safe, professional, and affordable nonbinary recovery residences and various recovery support services. Within our homes, individuals learn responsibility, accountability, financial independence, life skills, and most of all; how to love themselves. We walk with those we serve to empower them to heal and ultimately realize their potential, goals, and dreams.

OUR MISSION

is to provide housing, recovery support, life skills and a loving support system for LGBTQ+ individuals with mental health, substance use disorders and life skill challenges so that they can live fearlessly as their authentic selves. Our goal is to help individuals implement healthy life and recovery skills into daily living.

RESIDENTS

- Are 18 years or older
- Are medically and psychologically stable
- · Have a strong desire for their own recovery
- Abstain from alcohol and drug use
- · Commit to a minimum of 3 months, 6-12 months are recommended
- · Adhere to the continuing care plan of their referral source
- Agree to self-care practices addressing medical & psychological health
- · Agree to frequent, random drug and alcohol screening
- Abstain from relationships and sexual activity, unless in a previous committed relationship
- Attend all Lambda HOPE group activities and community meetings
- Commit to productive activity. occupational, volunteer, or academic

WHAT IS LGBTQ+?

LGBTQ+: An umbrella term that is used to describe a person's sexuality or gender identity. Each letter represents a different group:

Lesbian: A woman/woman-aligned who is attracted to other people of the same/similar gender.

Gay: A man/man-aligned who is attracted to people of the same/ similar gender.

Bisexual: A person who may be attracted to multiple or all genders.

Transgender: Anyone who does not identify with their gender assigned at birth.

Queer/Questioning: A person who has gender expansive or nonbinary (gender fluid, neutral, or unspecified) identities.

+ (**Plus**): Signifies all the gender identities and sexual orientations that are not specifically covered by the other five initials.

THE LGBTQ+ COMMUNITY ADDICTION & MENTAL HEALTH

Members of the LGBTQ+ community are 3 times more likely to abuse drugs and alcohol than the population as a whole. The LGBTQ+ community suffers from higher rates of substance abuse due in part to societally imposed obstacles they face that those who identify as heterosexual do not including:

- Hate crimes, emotional abuse, and public humiliation
- Rejection by family and friends
- Discrimination based on sexual orientation or identity
- Transphobia
- Internalized homophobia
- Loss of employment or promotion opportunities

Often, LGBTQ+ individuals will turn to drugs and alcohol to cope with the stress, anxiety and depression resulting from these challenges. Yet there is a lack of LGBTQ+ addiction recovery resources across the country. This is why it is so critically important that we create safe places and eliminate barriers to entry for anyone in the LGBTQ+ community to find recovery help.

Less than 1% of all recovery facilities offer services tailored specifically to the needs of EGBTQ individuals.
